

No Charges in Fire Death of Russian Boy in U.S.

LINCOLN, Nebraska — Authorities say they won't file charges in the death of a 9-year-old boy who emigrated from Russia to the U.S. and died last month in a house fire.

Lancaster County Attorney Joe Kelly said Wednesday that investigators couldn't determine what caused the fire and didn't find evidence of criminal behavior.

Anton Fomin died of carbon monoxide and soot inhalation in the May 17 fire in Nebraska. His death drew attention from Russian officials following several high-profile abuse cases of Russian children placed with American families.

Anton came to the United States with his biological parents before he was placed with a different family. His father died of cancer, and relatives say his mother couldn't care for him because of mental health problems.
