

\$20Bln Debt Written Off

Russia has written off more than \$20 billion in⊠debt and⊠contributed \$50 million to⊠the World Bank Trust Fund to⊠support development projects in⊠African countries, a⊠senior Foreign Ministry official told the⊠UN General Assembly.
