

Mortar Shells Kill One Near Russian Embassy, Syria Says

DAMASCUS, Syria — A Syrian government official and local residents said mortar shells have landed near the Russian Embassy in Damascus, killing one person.

The official said four shells hit the capital's Mazraa neighborhood on Tuesday. He said one person was killed, and an unknown number of people were wounded in the attack. He spoke on condition of anonymity in line with regulations.

Residents in the area said the mortar shells landed about 150 meters from the building that houses the Russian Embassy in Damascus.

Russia is a close ally of President Bashar Assad's regime, which has been fighting insurgents since an uprising against his rule turned into a civil war two years ago.

The Syrian opposition is backed by the United States and its European allies.
