Friday is bringing us something very special: the world-famous king of electro-swing, also known as Parov Stelar. Moscow loves this Austrian DJ, whose real name, by the way, is Marcus Fureder — a little bit of fan trivia for you there! Parov Stelar performed here just last year, but he has got a new album out, called *The Invisible Girl*, so you can catch all your favorite tracks and some brand new ones all in one night.

For all you death metal fans out there, the name Carcass should ring a bell. These guys have been around the block a few times and are credited with pioneering both grindcore and melodic death metal. This tour is aimed at promoting their new album, their first in 17 years, which is no small feat. So if you want to rock out and start your weekend with a bang, go check these guys out! They're playing at the brand-new Volta Club, which is located at 19 Bumazhny Proyezd, building 3, Savelovskaya metro station. The concert kicks off at 8 p.m. Friday, after which the band moves on to St. Petersburg.

And for those of you who prefer something a bit lighter, then you should make your way to Teatr club, located on 20 Staraya Basmannaya Ulitsa, building 1. They are hosting singer-songwriter Everlast on Sunday who — if you're struggling to place him — was the frontman of popular 1990s rap group House of Pain before leaving the band to pursue a solo career, and a very successful one at that. But before you panic and start imagining acoustic rap, whatever that may sound like in your mind, just remember that Everlast's music is actually a unique blend of rock, blues, country and spellbinding lyrics. His latest album, *The Life Acoustic*, has gotten rave reviews, so give yourself the perfect chilled-out Sunday with some great music before the work week madness begins.
