


A Uniquely Russian Gift Guide: 6 Suggestions for Christmas Presents (Photo Essay)

3. Fake Perfume



A variety of knock-off and fake perfumes are available in Moscow for the special woman in your life, many of which from 70-ruble shops. This one is branded after the popular Russian social network. (Nelli Ermolaeva / VKontakte)

4. Gold Toothpaste



The Gold toothpaste produced by Russian oral care brand Splat is described as: "The first precious GOLD toothpaste with colloidal gold, diamond extract, and royal jelly...Pink champagne taste...For very important persons" (Splat)

5. Black Bread Shampoo
