

New U.S. Ambassador Begins Term in Moscow

John Tefft presented his credentials as the new U.S. Ambassador to Moscow on Monday during a meeting with Deputy Foreign Minister Sergei Ryabkov.

A statement published on the Foreign Ministry's website said Ryabkov and Tefft had discussed some of the "pending questions on the Russian–U.S. bilateral agenda" during their meeting. According to the U.S. Embassy's Twitter account, Tefft arrived in Moscow on Friday.

Tefft, who has arrived to Moscow when Russian–U.S. relations are at their lowest since the end of the Cold War, was sworn in last week by U.S. Secretary of State John Kerry.

His arrival ends a period of interregnum at the U.S. Embassy after the previous head of the mission, Michael McFaul, resigned in February.

Unlike McFaul, an academic by trade, Tefft is a career diplomat. He has previously served as U.S. Ambassador to Ukraine, Georgia and Lithuania, and he was also deputy chief of the mission to Moscow in 1996-1999.
