Its leader, Daniil Shaykhinurov, aka Daniel Shake, may be more familiar in the context of his better-known projects — Obe Dve and OQJAV, both with Katya Pavlova and Vadik Korolyov. In La Vtornik, Daniel Shake collaborates with Kirill Bitov, and the result is quite danceable. It has funky guitar riffs familiar to OQJAV fans and texts in Russian and English about life in a big city that everyone in Moscow can relate to.
