

Russia's Football Team Gets New Manager

Stanislav Cherchesov has been appointed as the man to lead Russia's football team into the 2018 Russia World Cup. Russia's Football Union announced the appointment in a statement on Twitter on Thursday, setting Cherchesov the task of reaching the semi-final of the competition.

Cherchesov however, said that he would take the team to the final.

The 52-year-old Cherchesov will sign a deal worth 2 million euros (\$2.2 million) a year, which will last until the end of 2018, the Match TV channel reported.

A former international player with both the Soviet and Russian teams, Cherchesov has managed some of Russia's biggest teams and recently experienced success with Polish team Legia Warsaw.

Cherchesov takes over a team at a very low ebb. Previous manager Leonid Slutsky resigned

after the team exited June's European Championship without winning a match. A petition to reform Russia's national team with completely new players subsequently gathered almost one million signatures.
