

## Anti-NATO Military Drills Begin in Belarus

August 23, 2016



More than 1,000 soldiers are taking part in joint military exercises in Belarus with the Collective™Security Treaty Organization (CSTO), the Belarussian Defense Ministry announced Tuesday.

Seen by many as a Russian counterpart to NATO, the CSTO is an intergovernmental military ■alliance between six post-Soviet states: Russia, Armenia, ■Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, and Tajikistan.

Tensions between Russia and NATO have deteriorated dramatically since the annexation of Crimea in 2014. NATO announced at its biennial summit in July that <u>four new battalions</u> would be stationed in the Baltic region and Poland as a response to "Russian aggression" in the area.

Representatives of the United⊠Nations Secretariat and the International Committee of the Red Cross have been⊠invited to oversee the exercise, the Belarussian Defense Ministry said.
