

Hackers Blamed for Announcement of Fake Ukraine Defense Ministry MH17 Briefing

Hackers have been blamed for a fake announcement claiming that the Ukrainian Defense Ministry would hold an "emergency briefing" on the downed Malaysia Airlines Flight MH17.

The declaration was made on a website of the Information–Analytical Center for Ukrainian National Security, which came⊠under cyber–attack from an unknown party on Friday morning, the Slon news website⊠reported.

The hackers also claimed that excerpts of the a conversation between the MH17 flight crew and Ukrainian air traffic controllers were set to be released, the 112.ua news website reported.

Website⊠ moderators said that they had been targeted⊠for their "modest contribution in⊠the war against Russia for the territorial⊠integrity of Ukraine," Slon reported.

Malaysia Airlines Flight MH17 crashed over eastern⊠Ukraine in July 2014, killing all⊠298 people on board.

A Dutch-led⊠investigation concluded on Monday that the⊠plane had been brought down by a Buk missile,⊠ fired from an area held by pro-Russian separatists.
