

Finland Scrambles Jets After 2 'Possible' Russian Airspace Violations

Russian jets may have violated Finland's airspace twice in the past 24 hours, <u>the Finnish</u> <u>Defense Ministry has announced.</u>

Military jets were forced to scramble to meet the alleged Su-27 fighter⊠planes over the Baltic Sea on Thursday.

In a statement, the ministry said that Russia's military presence over the Baltic Sea on Thursday had been "intense."

Russia's Defense Ministry denied that the jets had strayed⊠from neutral waters over the Gulf of Finland.

Helsinki has reported several breaches of its airspace by Russia**Z** since 2014, when Moscow annexed the Crimean Peninsula.
