

Russia Supreme Court Proposes Ban on Pre-Trial Detention for Economic Crimes

The plenum of Russia's Supreme Court⊠has proposed banning the arrest of individuals accused of several⊠varieties of economic crimes, the Prime news agency reported Thursday.

According to the proposal, suspects can\substill be detained, but cannot be kept in pre-trial detention if they\substand accused of several economic crimes: commercial fraud,\substand money laundering, revealing banking or commercial secrets,\substandardering embezzlement, engaging in the illegal circulation of precious metals,\substantardering market manipulation.

However, some conditions apply. To⊠qualify under the proposal, a suspect must have a permanent residence⊠registered in Russia, must be identified, must not have previously⊠broken conditions of arrest or parol, and must not have hidden from⊠arrest.

The proposal has not yet been approved.
