

70% of Russians Want Better Ties With West

Seventy-one percent of Russians want to improve economic, ■political and cultural ties with the West, a report released by independent ■pollster the Levada Center has revealed.

The figure has soared since July 2015, when just 50 percent**Z**of Russians wanted to improve relations.

Just over half of respondents claimed that Eastern Europe⊠had nothing to fear from Russia, with 52 percent saying that Moscow posed no⊠threat to NATO members.

At the same time, 57 percent of respondents said that Russia⊠had reason to fear NATO, with 31 percent seeing no danger in the military alliance. ■Twelve percent of respondents were undecided.

On decisive issues such as the Syrian conflict, some 70\(\mathbb{Z}\) percent said that Russia played an important role in resolving international\(\mathbb{Z}\) problems.

The West's view of Russia was only important for 44 percent of Russians, with 51 percent claiming that they did not care about Western ■attitudes.

The poll was conducted on Nov. 18 to 21 among 1,600 in 28⊠Russian regions.
