

Pacific Island Rejects Plan for Tropical Russian Empire

The pacific nation **■** of Kiribati has rejected a proposal to construct an "alternative **■**Russia" on the territory of three of its unoccupied islands.

The unusual plan⊠came from millionaire Anton Bakov, a former Russian parliamentarian⊠who now leads the obscure Russian Monarchist Party, the Lenta.ru news site <u>reported</u>. The eccentric⊠politician offered to invest around \$350 million in Kiribati in⊠return for the right to resurrect the Russian Empire there.

Bakov promised to ■develop the three islands he would rent from the impoverished nation. He planned to build an airport, a seaport, ■a solar energy station, hospitals, schools, and even the University ■of the Russian Empire.

Nonetheless, on ■Feb. 24, a special government commission on foreign investment ■rejected the proposal. The stumbling ■block appears to have been Bakov's request for temporary

sovereign rights over the islands.

The millionaire presented the ■plan as more of a technical restoration of the Russian Empire than colonization of the Pacific.

"The equatorial climate doesn't suit the Russian people..." he told the Guardian. As a result,
"the number of Russian's living on the islands will likely be one to two percent."
