

Jon Huntsman Confirmed as Next U.S. Ambassador to Russia

Jon Huntsman has been confirmed as Washington's man in Moscow, following the departure of John Tefft on Thursday.

The U.S. Senate on Thursday unanimously <u>confirmed</u> the appointment of Huntsman, a former envoy to China, alongside new U.S. envoys to Afghanistan, Bahrain and an assistant state secretary for European and Eurasian Affairs.

The Russian media and officials have <u>portrayed</u> Huntsman as a "hardliner" at a time when Russian–U.S. diplomatic relations have soured over election meddling allegations.

Appointed by the Trump administration in July, Huntsman <u>said</u> in last week's confirmation hearing that "there is no question" that Moscow interfered in the U.S. presidential election.

Huntsman <u>wrote</u> on Twitter after his confirmation that he was "honored and humbled" to serve in the new capacity.

Huntsman's Russian counterpart, Anatoly Antonov, extended his congratulations. "I wish him success in restoring Russian-American relations," he was <u>quoted</u> as saying by the Interfax news agency.
