

Rosneft CEO Igor Sechin Dodges Court Appearance Again

The CEO of Russian oil giant Rosneft and key witness in a bribery case against a former minister has been summoned to appear in court for the third time.

Former Economic Development Minister Alexei Ulyukayev has been under house arrest since his detention last November. He is suspected of demanding \$2 million to approve the purchase of the Bashneft oil firm by Rosneft.

Rosneft spokesman Mikhail Leontiev told the state-run TASS news agency that Sechin didn't show up because he was on a "scheduled business trip."

summons by e-mail, fax and post.

Moscow's Zamoskvoretsky District Court judge ruled to issue a third summons to Sechin to testify at the next hearing on Wednesday, Nov. 22, the news website Mediazona <u>reported</u>.
