The school day in Russia's northeastern republic of Sakha ended in time for a vicious snowstorm to accompany children during their walk home.

A blogger in the region posted a <u>video</u> of their treacherous march on his Twitter feed. Whipped by the freezing winds and snow, the children are seen not so much walking as tumbling over, pulling each other along.
