

Russia's Supreme Court Overrules Deportation of Gay Journalist

Russia's Supreme Court has overruled the decision to deport Khudoberdi Nurmatov, a gay journalist who writes under the pen name Ali Feruz for the investigative Novaya Gazeta newspaper.

A Moscow city court ruled in August to forcibly <u>deport</u> Nurmatov to Uzbekistan, where he holds citizenship, for violating migration law, while his Russian asylum application was <u>turned</u> down by a court in October. The journalist's supporters say that he risks persecution and torture in Uzbekistan and have <u>launched</u> an international campaign in his defense titled: "We Don't Have the Right Not to Save Him."

Russia's Supreme Court <u>overturned</u> Nurmatov's deportation order Monday, ruling that his case "had not received the necessary legal evaluation."

It urged the Moscow City Court to review a letter sent from the German Embassy confirming that Nurbatov has permission to reside in Germany.

The Supreme Court also said that the city court's indefinite extension of Nurmatov's stay in a temporary holding facility for foreigners was "an unjustified restriction on his freedom."
