

Moscow Mayor Promises \$70,000 Reward for Olympic Medalists

Sergei Sobyanin, Mayor of Moscow, has promised a reward of four million rubles (\$69,500) to every Muscovite who brings back a gold medal from the Olympics.

Almost 170 Russian athletes are competing in the Winter Olympics in Pyeongchang. They are competing under a <u>neutral flag</u> following doping allegations and have won <u>five medals</u> so far, none gold.

"Every Russian athlete who receives a gold medal should be considered a national hero," Sobyanin was <u>cited</u> as saying by the state-run TASS news agency.

Following the Sochi Winter Games in 2014, Russian medalists were <u>awarded</u> luxury SUVs, with their value depending on the color of their medal. Prime Minister Dmitry Medvedev

personally handed over the car keys.
