

Russian Schoolgirl Wounds 7 in Air Gun Shooting

A 13-year-old student in central Russia has reportedly wounded seven people with an air gun in an attack planned with two classmates.

A <u>spate</u> of deadly school attacks has hit Russia over the past six months. The Kremlin suggested in January that the "evils" of the internet may have played a role in the attacks.

"Three girls closed the classroom [door] and began the shooting. One person was taken away in an ambulance. He was shot in the temple from an air gun," an unnamed student in Kurgan region <u>told</u> the Znak.com news website Wednesday.

"They likely decided to repeat Columbine," the student said, referring to the 1999 Columbine High School shooting in the U.S. state of Colorado.

The state-run TASS news agency <u>cited</u> regional investigators as saying that they were looking into the incident and that the air gun may have belonged to the schoolgirl's father.

The agency <u>cited</u> health officials as saying that one injured student has been discharged after being treated, while the other six got away with bruises.

A local journalist told the Dozhd TV news channel the alleged shooter has been detained.
