

Russia Knocked Out of Eurovision Contest in Semi-Finals

Russia's entry in the Eurovision Song Contest will not reach the competition's final stage for the first time in 14 years after singer Yulia Samoylova failed to garner enough votes in the semis.

Samoylova, who uses a wheelchair, was banned from the competition in Ukraine last year over a 2015 performance in Russian-controlled Crimea, in what Kiev <u>said</u> was a violation of its sovereignty. The move prompted Russia to <u>withdraw</u> from a competition that is increasingly viewed as becoming politicized.

"This was a very cool, unforgettable experience for me," Samoylova was <u>cited</u> as saying by the state-run RIA Novosti agency Friday, after her performance of "I Won't Break" failed to

generate enough online votes in the semifinals.
