

Russian Regulator Blacklists WhatsApp IP Addresses Before Reversing Decision

Russia's state media watchdog on Thursday briefly blocked the WhatsApp messaging service in what appears to be a continuation of its campaign to block the Telegram application.

Media watchdog Roskomnadzor <u>blacklisted</u> 10.8 million IP addresses on Thursday, including those of Google and Amazon, disrupting a range of unrelated online services for Russian users. Fifty organizations including Amnesty International, Human Rights Watch and Transparency International <u>appealed</u> for Russia to unblock Telegram in an open letter on Tuesday.

"So, WhatsApp users, here you are: 329 WhatsApp IP addresses," Filipp Kulin, the software engineer who developed a tool that monitors Roskomnadzor's blacklists, wrote in a social

media post Thursday.

Users of both WhatsApp and Viber reported accessibility issues in Russia and Central Europe on Thursday afternoon, the RBC business portal <u>reported</u>.

The Meduza news website <u>reported</u> half an hour later that the WhatsApp addresses were removed from Roskomnadzor's registry of banned sites.
