

Lokomotiv Moscow Fined for Racist Chanting at Derby

Russia's football union has fined Lokomotiv Moscow for its fans' racist chants against a Brazilian forward at a crime-laden derby last week.

The Lokomotiv-CSKA match last Friday has been embroiled in controversy, starting with the <u>beating death</u> of a fan traveling to the game and ending with the <u>arrest</u> of several fans afterward for displaying Nazi symbols and fighting at the stadium. CSKA claimed its seventh overall Russian Super Cup with a 1-0 win in the match against Lokomotiv in Nizhny Novgorod.

This Friday, the Russian Football Union said it <u>fined</u> Lokomotiv 50,000 rubles (\$790) for the behavior of its fans, who shouted racist insults at CSKA forward Vitinho.

"It wasn't widespread chanting, video showed the number of people was very small," the state-run TASS news agency <u>quoted</u> the head of the union's disciplinary committee as saying.
