

Teen Detained on Suspicion of Burning Down 18th-Century Russian Church

A 15-year-old has been placed in custody on suspicion of setting fire to a historic 18th-century church under state protection.

Built entirely out of wood in Russia's northwestern republic of Karelia in 1774, the Dormition Church of Kondopoga <u>burned</u> to the ground last week.

The regional branch of Russia's Investigative Committee <u>said</u> it had detained the teen and assigned a psychological evaluation.

"The teenager has been placed in the Karelian Interior Ministry's temporary detention [center] for juvenile delinquents for 30 days," the state-run TASS news agency quoted branch

spokeswoman Olga Golubenko as saying Monday.

According to the Mash Telegram channel, the alleged arsonist <u>said</u> he had been motivated by "a wish to attain worldwide fame."
