

Russian Hospital Tells Doctors They Have Huge Salaries, Sparking Uproar

Maternity doctors in central Russia had a hearty laugh after hearing their boss read out salaries three to four times higher than their actual pay, a video posted to Russian social media showed.

The simple yet defiant act of laughter captured national attention this week at a time when Russians' real incomes have <u>slumped</u> for five straight years.

In the video from the Salavat maternity <u>hospital</u> 1,500 kilometers east of Moscow, doctors and nurses <u>gasped and laughed</u> when the head of the hospital listed average salaries during a meeting with a representative from the presidential human rights council.

Albina Fatykhova, the head of the hospital, said that doctors earn 61,200 rubles (\$940) and midwives earn 35,400 rubles (\$544) per month during the meeting.

"The numbers [she read] were massively inflated," one of the nurses present at the meeting was cited as <u>saying</u> by the Dozhd television channel. "Our salaries are three to four times lower."

Fatykhova later <u>criticized</u> the laughter as a "scripted performance."

Officials <u>say</u> dozens of hospital employees had quit — for reasons including low pay — before footage of the laughing doctors went viral. Regional authorities <u>terminated</u> an agreement allowing a private company to run the hospital following the scandal.
