

Russian Air Force Receives First New MiG-35 Fighters

Russia's Air Force has received its first delivery of two MiG-35 fighter jets, the corporation that manufactures the jets has said.

Air Force commander-in-chief Viktor Bondarev in 2017 <u>announced</u> the Defense Ministry's plans to replace its entire fleet of light fighters with the MiG-35, a modernized version of the ship-based MiG-29K fighters which Russia has <u>used</u> in Syria.

"The first two aircraft have already been transferred to the Air Force for testing," Ilya Tarasenko, general director of MiG, <u>told</u> the state-run RIA Novosti news agency on Monday.

The remaining four planes will be delivered by the end of the year, Tarasenko said. MiG expects to sign a new contract with the Defense Ministry for the planes, he added.
