

Putin's Approval Rating Steadily Increases to 68%, Survey Says

President Vladimir Putin's approval rating has grown in recent months but remains at pre-Crimean annexation lows, an independent Levada Center polling agency survey said on Friday.

Putin's approval ratings have <u>hovered</u> in the mid-to-low 60s since he <u>enacted</u> unpopular reforms gradually increasing Russians' retirement ages last summer.

Putin's job approval has climbed to 68 percent this month from 66 percent in April-May and 64 percent in January-March, Levada Center's poll results <u>said</u>.

These minor gains within the margin of error could climb even higher after this month's <u>increase</u> in pension payouts, Levada's head of research Alexei Levinson told The Moscow

Times.

"If we see that [Putin's] approval level remains the same or goes up by fall, we'll be able to talk about changes in public opinion over the pensions increase," Levinson said.

Putin's approval rating <u>reached</u> an all-time high of 87 percent in August 2014 in the aftermath of Russia's annexation of Crimea from Ukraine.

It began falling throughout 2018 and <u>hit</u> its lowest mark since 2013 last fall.

Levada conducted the survey among 1,608 respondents in 50 Russian regions between June 27 and July 4.
