

Russia Certifies European University at St. Petersburg's Master's Programs

Russia's state education watchdog has issued accreditation to one of the country's leading private universities' master's degree programs after a three-year lapse.

The watchdog, Rosobrnadzor, <u>stripped</u> the European University at St. Petersburg (EUSP) of its accreditation and revoked its license over building code violations in 2016, <u>taking over</u> its main campus in early 2018. It <u>restored</u> EUSP's license in August 2018, ending two years of turmoil that left its foreign students <u>scrambling</u> for alternative options.

A Rosobrnadzor order published by the university on Thursday accredits EUSP's master's programs for the next six years.

The university <u>said</u> Rosobrnadzor planned to update its online list of accredited institutions to

include EUSP within three days of the order.

The accreditation means that graduates will be awarded state-accredited degrees and students will be able to defer military service, EUSP chief of staff Alla Samolyotova <u>told</u> St. Petersburg's paperpaper.ru news website.

Founded in 1994, EUSP offers courses to Russian and international students in the social sciences and humanities.
