

Poland Captures Suspected Russian Spy, Media Reports

Poland has detained and charged a man with spying for Russia, the country's state broadcaster TVP <u>reported</u> Monday.

The arrest is the latest in a string of espionage-related cases in Russia, which <u>sentenced</u> a Polish national to 14 years in prison in June, and Poland, which <u>sentenced</u> an ex-government employee to three years in July.

Polish internal security agents reportedly apprehended the man, identified only as Piotr Ś., in Warsaw on Oct. 24.

Piotr Ś. "is suspected of declaring his willingness to cooperate with Russian services against the Republic of Poland," the Poland In network <u>quoted</u> the country's internal security agency

spokesman Stanisław Żaryn as saying.

Authorities were said to have found weapons and ammunition in the suspect's apartment.

He has been placed in pretrial detention for three months, according to the <u>reports</u>.
