

Russian Woman Caught Smuggling Gold Bars Taped to Feet Into China

A woman in Russia's Far East was caught with about 2 kilograms of solid gold taped to the bottoms of her feet as she attempted to cross the border into China.

The unnamed woman was visibly nervous and walking unnaturally toward the security checkpoint when a customs inspector at the Zabaikalsk border crossing spotted her, the Far Eastern Customs Administration said in a <u>statement</u> Tuesday. As she walked through the metal detector, inspectors discovered eight gold bars weighing a total of 1,864 grams taped to the woman's feet.

An expert told the customs service that the gold bars were likely produced by hand and worth 5 million rubles (about \$8,000).

The woman said that a Chinese citizen had convinced her to smuggle the gold for a cash reward. Authorities have opened a criminal case against the suspect, and she now faces up to seven years in prison on charges of illegal movement of strategic goods and resources.

The customs service added that Russian nationals have repeatedly tried to smuggle gold into China this year. In August, a woman tried to haul 10 golden bars under the insoles of her sneakers.

It's far from the only creative crime to come from Russia in recent years. Two suspects were detained in 2018 two suspects reportedly <u>attempting to use</u> a cat to smuggle drugs into a prison, but in mid-October the cat <u>managed</u> to escape.
