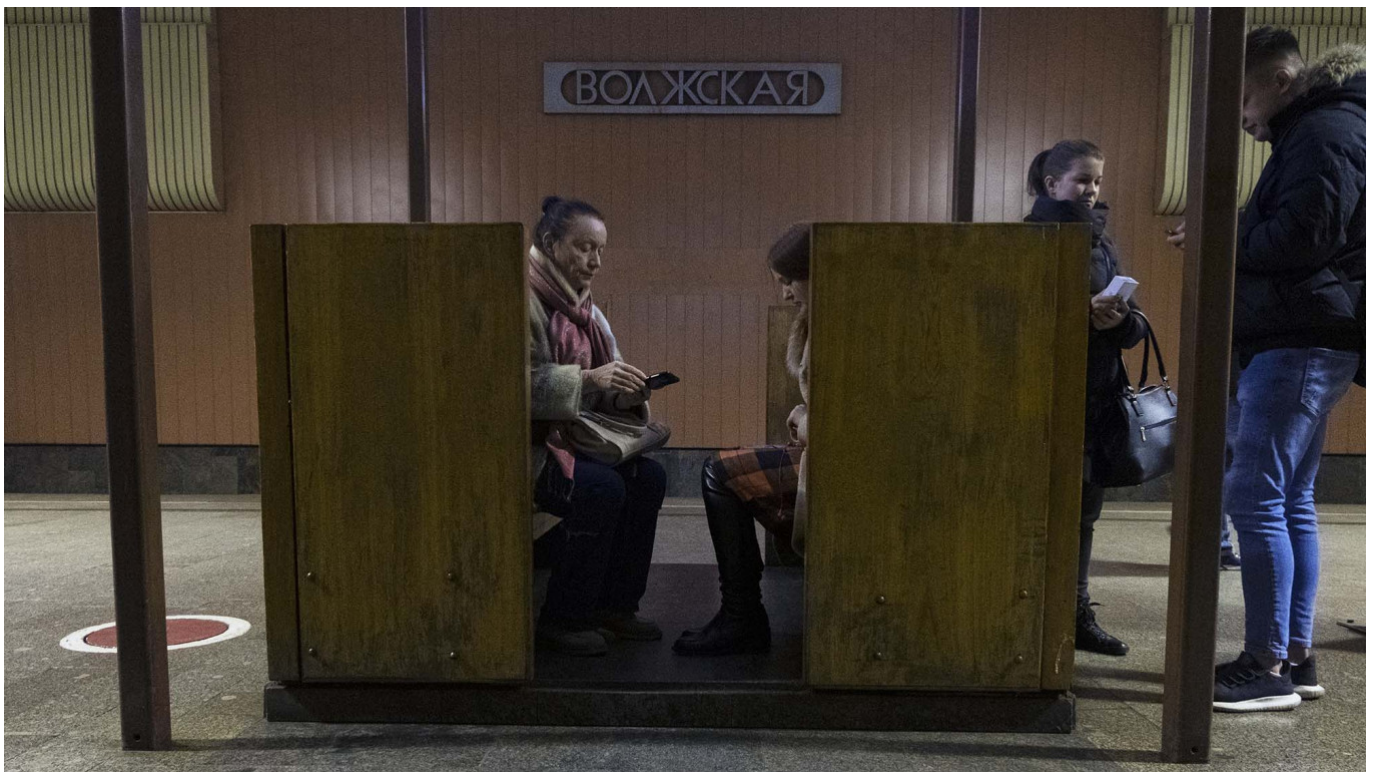


Everyday Life in the Moscow Metro
