

Russia and Turkey Cut Short Joint Patrol in Syria's Idlib

Russia and Turkey were forced to cut short their second joint patrol in Syria's Idlib region on Monday due to security concerns, the Russian Defence Ministry said in a statement.

Their first joint patrol was also cut short earlier this month due to what Moscow called "rebel provocations."

Russia and Turkey are trying to uphold a ceasefire agreement in the region.
