Most restaurants have specials on Feb. 14, and you'll be able to buy flowers on every street corner (for many times their usual price, but love is worth it, isn't it?) Here are some special events to share with that special someone.

Find romance at the top of the world

Do you have a houseful of kids? Are your in-laws in town? Did your dog just have puppies? And is the street noise in your second-floor flat giving you a permanent headache? Here's just what you need: a city getaway for two on the 29th floor of a Moscow City skyscraper. Five hours in a spacious loft apartment. Panoramic views of Moscow as far as the eye can see. A projector and huge screen for watching one of dozens of movies. And food and drink delivered straight to your door. Rent out the "Anti-movie theater" for the morning, afternoon or

Depo is one of Moscow's newest and arguably one of its best food courts, where you can buy just about anything edible from anywhere in the world and choose from several dozen restaurants and cafes serving an enormous variety of food.
