

Putin Flies Supersonic Bomber During Tatarstan Visit

Russian President Vladimir Putin on Thursday <u>flew</u> a Tupolev Tu-160M strategic bomber, state-run news agencies reported, in what is likely a campaign stunt ahead of the March 15-17 presidential election.

The Tu-160M, a modernized version of a Cold War-era bomber, has two internal bomb bays, each of which can hold up to six cruise missiles or 12 short-range nuclear missiles.

"Together we are observing this unique moment," Kremlin journalist Pavel Zarubin <u>said</u> in a video of the takeoff published on his Telegram channel, adding that the flight route was a "military secret."

State media <u>reported</u> that Putin's flight time totaled 30 minutes, while the Interfax news

agency <u>quoted</u> the Russian leader as saying after landing that the aircraft had "excellent equipment."

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov told reporter Zarubin that Putin decided to fly the strategic bomber during a <u>visit</u> on Wednesday to the Kazan Aviation Plant in the republic of Tatarstan.

Putin previously <u>flew</u> a Tu-160 during a training exercise outside Moscow in 2005.

The modernized Tu-160M made its first test flight in January 2022, one month before Russian forces invaded Ukraine.
