

Yabloko Leader Slams Exiled Opposition's Voting Strategy

Nikolai Rybakov, the chairman of the liberal opposition party Yabloko, has [criticized](#) the tactical voting strategy promoted by exiled opposition figures Yulia Navalnaya and Maxim Katz ahead of this weekend's parliamentary elections.

In a video released on Monday, Navalnaya and Katz said they had joined forces and [agreed](#) to endorse a joint slate of candidates in single-seat constituencies. For party-list candidates, they urged Russian voters to back anyone running from a political party other than the ruling United Russia party.

"These people put my comrades in prison for 11 years, and now you want us to support them in the elections?" Rybakov [told](#) a group of supporters in St. Petersburg late Tuesday, referring to the [jailing](#) of Yabloko members in recent years.

"[Navalnaya and Katz] are proposing to dance to their tune again and vote for the very people who led to the death of people in Russia and Ukraine," he said in a video shared by the outlet

Varlamov News.

Rybakov accused Navalnaya and Katz of “manipulating [voters] from abroad” and told supporters that following their voting strategy “will end in the deaths of people and prison terms.”

Yabloko, Russia’s oldest liberal party, was [disqualified](#) from the party-list vote after the Russian Supreme Court ruled in August that it had engaged in copyright violations during political campaigning and had broken campaign finance laws.

More than 100 Yabloko candidates, who are all running on a pro-peace platform, are still allowed to compete in single-member constituencies, but they appear unlikely to win any seats in parliament.

Under Russian election law, half of the State Duma’s 450 seats are distributed among the list of political parties that receive more than 5% of the votes. The remaining 225 seats are given to the winners of elections in single-member constituencies.

Under Rybakov’s leadership, Yabloko has urged supporters to spoil party-list ballots and vote for the remaining single-district candidates when three-day voting begins this Friday.

Four other systemic opposition parties are participating in the State Duma elections: the Communist Party, the ultra-nationalist Liberal Democratic Party of Russia (LDPR), New People and the left-leaning A Just Russia party. Each party broadly supports the war against Ukraine and tends to vote in line with United Russia on key issues.

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
